



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
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From the Founder:



North Carolina College of Theology Administrative Policies

Our Program Basis

It is the purpose of the North Carolina College of Theology Administration to provide continued educational programs to students who are looking to educate themselves in the Word of God. We believe that we offer the finest Christian education available in a streamlined fashion.

We have purposely structured our requirements for graduate and post-graduate degrees in an effort to hold the tuition to a minimum and allow students ample time to complete his or her desired field of study. Our experienced staff and faculty have labored untiringly over text and materials, separating arduous minor information from major academic information.

What We Believe

We are a fundamental, evangelical, Bible-believing school based upon canonized Old Testament and New Testament scripture as the inerrant and infallible Word of God. We accept that the Bible is God's instruction manual for life, and it is not open to any single or denominational interpretation but is written to all mankind.

It is our belief that God created the earth and the universe in six literal days and that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, born of a virgin. We believe that Jesus died on the cross at Calvary, arose from the dead three days later, and now sits at the right hand of God as our High Priest. We believe that those who have been born-again through the Blood of Jesus Christ will reign in Heaven for eternity. Finally, we believe that non-believers will be sentenced to a burning hell for eternity.

Student Nondiscrimination Policy

The North Carolina College of Theology admits students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin with all rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students of NCCT. The North Carolina College of Theology does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its policies, loan programs, or other school administered programs.

Statement of Standards

All students are required to give a testimony of having accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. Each student is expected to conduct himself/herself in a manner that will, at no time, bring reproach upon our Savior or upon NCCT.

All students must be a working part of a local church. Time spent in participation within the local church will be logged and turned in to the North Carolina College of Theology. These hours are figured into the student's semester credit hours as personal ministry. God's Word demands that we be doers of the Word and not hearers (or students) only.

Admission Policy

NCCT's admission policy is an open enrollment. You must complete an application along with a \$60 application fee. You must provide a copy of your high school diploma or transcript/GED completion. Your application will be reviewed at which time you will receive an acceptance letter or a letter with an explanation of non-acceptance.

Transferred Credits

The North Carolina College of Theology reserves the right to allow, or not to allow, credits earned at other institutions for similar courses taken at that institution. If credit is awarded, the candidate will be assessed \$2.00 per credit hour. These hours may not exceed 60% of the required hours for graduation from the North Carolina College of Theology.

Refund Policy

Students may change or drop a program at any time during the first week after notification of their acceptance into the North Carolina College of Theology. When a program is dropped or withdrawn from and no substitute is taken, a 10% refund will be made, upon request. A student must notify the North Carolina College of Theology in writing of the intention to withdraw or drop a program.

General Information

Statement of Purpose

North Carolina College of Theology was founded in 2001 by the late, Dr. J. L. Cook. The college started in China Grove, NC with 9 students. Dr. Cook's purpose was to educate men and women of God that did not have the means or resources to attend college. In 2003 after the institution had grown considerable, Dr. Cook moved the college to Wilmington, NC. Under his leadership the college grew to students in 39 states and 112 countries. After his death in 2013, the college has continued to flourish under the leadership of Dr. Judy Cook and Dr. Timothy Cook.

NCCT, as a biblically based, evangelical community, is dedicated to the preparation of men and women for Christ-like servant-hood and leadership in the church, the marketplace and the world. The institution strives to raise up spiritual leaders to hear the voice of God, to communicate the Gospel with vitality, to lead with authority, to minister with compassion, to convey the resurrection power of hope with conviction.

NCCT's purpose can be summed up in one phrase: "Reach the World for Jesus, One student at a Time". By fulfilling this one statement, we can have a huge impact on the church, marketplace and the world.

NCCT believes there is only one God that created the heavens and the earth. The divine God-head consist of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We believe in the virgin birth of Jesus, who came to earth to save humans from their sins. We believe that God sent His only Son to suffer the death on a cross and was resurrected three days after His death. He then ascended to Heaven to intercede with the Father for our sins. We believe in the return of Jesus to earth to retrieve His remaining Saints. He will then defeat Satan and his foes. We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells in all believers to comfort, guide and correct.

NCCT believes that the Holy Bible is the inerrant and infallible Word of God. We believe that every word in the Bible was inspired by God for instructions to live a holy life. We believe that we should not add nor take away anything from the Holy Scriptures. We believe that the scriptures are without error or discrepancy. The Bible is the authority on which we base all our beliefs.

NCCT wants to provide an excellent education to all that want to learn. We want to guide, support and encourage all believers in a deeper walk with our Lord. Our goal is to educate the true meaning of Christianity, which is Love because He is Love!

Vision & Mission

Vision: NCCT, as a Christian institution, is reaching the world for Jesus one student at a time, equipping them with Biblically sound knowledge, for effective leadership and servant-hood to impact the Church, market-place and the world.

Mission: NCCT, a Christian institution, is equipping and empowering students within the world marketplace for Godly stewardship by preparing Christian servants who will become spiritually vibrant, Biblically strong, theologically balanced, Spirit-empowered, ministry-equipped and culturally sensitive.

Institutional Goals

The following are the Institutional Goals in support of the NCCT mission and to guide faculty, staff, administration, and the governing board decisions as it may relate to strategic planning, resource capacity and allocation, and program development and quality. Student objectives and program learning outcomes are identified for each degree offering in support of NCCT's mission. This first development of an IE (Institutional Effectiveness) plan is NCCT's promise of serving the mission, committing to continuous institutional and program improvement, and enhancing quality and transparency within and outside of institutional borders.

5. **Financial Infrastructure Goal:** Increase revenue and resources to fiscally strengthen the institutions for long-term financial security.

Philosophy



Associate of Arts in Biblical Studies

NCCT offers a two-year Associate Degree in Biblical Studies. Graduating students must successfully pass and complete all requirements for a minimum of 60 credit hours.

1. **General Core:** Students demonstrate knowledge of the basic principles and the appropriate skills of:
 - a. Oral and written communication
 - b. Fine arts and humanities
 - c. Natural science and mathematics
 - d. Social and behavioral sciences, and within the general studies
2. **Ministry Performance and Formation:** Students demonstrate knowledge and skills of serving in ministry by developing their own educational philosophy around formation addressing effective witnesses and servanthood in the church and the world at large.
3. **Biblical Knowledge:** Students demonstrate knowledge of the Old and New Testament and spiritual growth.

Prerequisite: *High School Diploma/GED;*
Born-again Experience; Active Church Attendance

Graduation Requirements: *Very Important. 3,000-word thesis paper needs to be written, per term. The topic for each term will be provided in your syllabus.*

Program Core Courses**

Course # [Credit Hours]

First Semester

NT-101 [3].....The Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John
Course Description: Chapter by chapter study of Jesus' ministry and teachings; a study of Matthew, Mark and Luke; chronological study of the ministry of Christ up to the "Passion Week", detailed account of the final week of Jesus' ministry, as recorded by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

NT-102 [3].....Pauline Epistles–Letters to the Church I:
Romans, I Corinthians, II Corinthians and Galatians
Course Description: A study of the doctrinal foundations of Christian faith, as laid by the Apostle Paul; study of the sovereignty of God and practical Christian principles; precept study emphasizing the particular disciplines and instructions given to God's people; conceptual study providing clear insight into the ministry of the Apostle Paul; comparison study of the law and grace.

PM-103 [3].....Preparing for Ministry
Course Description: This study will deal with different parts of ministry; Hearing the Voice of God, Impartation and Separation. Spiritual Reproduction, Anointing and Five Fold Ministry

PDG-104 [3].....Principles and Dominion of God I
Course Description: This study course will deal with the Principles and the Dominion of God. You will be reviewing the Christian's Promised Land mentioned in the Books of Exodus, Deuteronomy, Joshua and Galatians. You will also be reviewing the Kingdom Principles and operating in them as being in the Body of Christ.

Second Semester

NT-105 [3]Missionary Journeys of Paul: Book of Acts
Course Description: Detailed coverage of the supernatural work of God in the early Church; study of the life and missionary journeys of the Apostle of Paul.

NT-106 [3]Pauline Epistles–Letters to the Church II:
Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians,
I Thessalonians and II Thessalonians

Course Description: Comprehensive study that takes the believer on a journey into the promised land of Kingdom inheritance; brief background study and chapter precepts of the epistles-Philippians and Colossians.

PDG-107 [3]Principles and Dominion of God II

Course Description: Detailed study of the kingdom of God and learn that God desires to establish His kingdom in the Church so that He, through the Body of Christ, can exercise His dominion in the earth.

BF-108 [3]Biblical Finance

Course Description: In this study you will learn all that God's Word details concerning your finances. During this study you will all learn the principles of giving and the power that it possesses along with Tithes and Offerings.

Third Semester

NT-109 [3]Pauline Epistles–Paul's Personal Letters:
I Timothy, II Timothy, Titus and Philemon

Course Description: Chapter by chapter study of the Apostle Paul's pastoral instructions and admonitions; brief background study and chapter precepts of the epistles-Philemon.

NT-110 [3]General Epistles I: Hebrews and James

Course Description: Chapter study and overall view of the books Hebrews and James; study of the importance of growing in the Word of God and the joy Christians are able to find in the midst of suffering.

ANT-111 [3]Anthropology

Course Description: Detailed study of human beings and the understanding involves who humans are in the light of God's revelation in the Holy Scriptures.

Fourth Semester

NT-112 [3]General Epistles II: I Peter, II Peter,
I John, II John, III John and Jude

Course Description: Chapter study of the importance of growing in the Word of God and the joy Christians are able to find in the midst of suffering; careful study of all epistles with special attention given to John's emphasis on love and fellowship.

BP-113 [3]Biblical Prayer

Course Description: Study of prayers in the Bible prayed by people who served God; praying effectively.

GPS-114 [3]GPS Program- Guiding/ Positioning/ Serving

Course Descriptions and Requirements: The primary goal of NCCT is the training of future ministry leaders. This training involves a partnership between North Carolina College of Theology and local churches. In addition to the academic instruction, the program mandates a minimum of 200 hours of pastoral mentoring and practical experience, overseen by one or more of the student's pastors. This character-molding, hands-on aspect of training is structured around the Biblical qualifications of 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1 and includes a quarterly assessment of the student regarding his/her progress in godliness and service.

OT-201 [3].....Israel's Beginning I: Genesis and Exodus
Course Description: Chapter by chapter study with spiritual applications for the believer; study in the account of Israel's exodus from Egypt, giving insight into the types and shadows of Christ's redemptive work.

OT-202 [3]History of Israel I: Joshua, Judges, Ruth,
I Samuel, II Samuel
Course Description: Comparative study of the history of Israel's possession of "the Promised land" and its spiritual applications; study of God's repeated deliverance of Israel during a time of increasing national apostasy and the examples that heroes of faith provide for the believer; study of historical insight into the times lifestyles of the Jews, revealing allegorical truths of the relationship of Christ and His Church; spiritual application study of the prophet, Samuel's birth and public ministry.

SJ- 201 [3].....Study of Jesus I
Course Description: In this study you will review the life of Jesus Christ. The concentration will be focused on Practical teaching for daily living and Parables taught by Jesus Christ.

TS-201 [3]Topical Studies I
Course Description: This study will provide you a concentration in certain topics located in the Holy Bible. You will cover four different topics in this study; Fellowship, Dreams and Visions, Gideon's Army and Jezebel.

Second Semester

OT-203 [3]Israel's Beginning II: Leviticus, Numbers,
Deuteronomy
Course Description: Study of Leviticus and the rules of the ancient Israelites; understanding God's Word and its design.

OT-204 [3]History of Israel II: II Samuel,
Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther

Course Description: Devotional chapter by chapter study portraying the restoration of the temple and Jerusalem under the leadership of Ezra and Nehemiah; study of historical insight into the times and lifestyles of the Jews, revealing allegorical truths of the relationship of Christ and His Church. Continuation of Samuels public ministry.

OT-205 [3]Wisdom and Poetry I: Psalms

Course Description: A relatively detailed study of the book of Psalms; that focuses upon the enigma of human suffering, faith and the power of God; descriptive study of the characteristics of Hebrew poetry.

SJ-202 [3]Study of Jesus II

Course Description: In this study you will review the life of Jesus Christ. The concentration will be focused on the Ministry of Jesus Christ.

OT-206 [3]Kings of Israel and Judah: I Kings, II Kings,
I Chronicles, II Chronicles

Course Description: Comprehensive chapter study of the kings of Israel and Judah, beginning after David.

OT-207 [3]Wisdom and Poetry II: Proverbs

Course Description: Survey of the entire book of Proverbs, presented both topically and by chapter, taking the believer from pre-salvation, through instruction in the righteousness, to full maturity in Christ.

SJ-203 [3]Study of Jesus III

Course Description: In this study you will review the life of Jesus Christ. This course focuses on two topics pertaining to the life of Jesus Christ; Doctrine of Christ and Gospel of Jesus.

TS-202 [3] Topical Studies II
Course Description: This study will be providing you a concentration in certain topics located in the Holy Bible. You will cover four different topics in this study; Salvation, Truth about sin, Under the Influence and What is Truth.

Fourth Semester

OT-207 [3] Wisdom and Poetry: Job, Ecclesiastes,
Song of Solomon, Proverbs 31
Course Description: Comprehensive study of one of the Old Testament books of wisdom, which emphasized the spiritual principles, discovered by Solomon in his search for true reality; chapter by chapter study from a devotional and inspirational viewpoint that portrays the beautiful allegory of Jesus Christ and His Church.

BC-201 [3] Biblical Conduct & Ethics
Course Description: This study will provide you with what the Holy Bible teaches pertaining to Conduct and Ethics for your personal life and Ministry.

Course Description: This study begins with Ezekiel; Chapters 1-11; deals with Ezekiel's call to the ministry, the message of judgement upon Jerusalem and the nation of Israel, includes historical charts; Chapters 12-28; relates how God spoke through Ezekiel to the false prophets and false shepherds; describes the fall and judgement of Lucifer; Chapters 29-48; covers the judgment of Egypt, the valley of dry bones prophecy, and the fulfillment of end-time event; includes charts.

MIN-501 [3].....Minor Prophets I: Hosea, Joel, Amos,
Obadiah, Jonah, Micah

Course Description: Course is concentrated on six of the Minor Prophets writings of men who were inspired by God.

ESC-501 [3].....Eschatology I

Course Description: In-depth study by Dr. Sherlock Bally into the Book of Revelation; concerning death, judgment and the final destiny of the soul and humankind

TS-503 [3].....Topical Studies III

Course Description: This study will be providing you a concentration in certain topics located in the Holy Bible. You will cover seven different topics in this study; God's Plan for Humanity, Praise and Worship, Revelation of Creation, Sovereignty of God, The Prophet Ministry and the Wickedness of Carnality.

MAJ-502 [3]Major Prophets II: Isaiah,
Jeremiah and Lamentations

Course Description: Isaiah; intense study of the book of Isaiah concerning the denunciation of Israel, Judah and other nations along with numerous prophecies of the Messiah and the coming Kingdom. Jeremiah; Chapters 1-18; deals with the call of Jeremiah, general and unrelated prophecies. Chapters 19-40; covers specific and dated prophecies. Chapters 41-52; covers specific prophecies and prophecies concerning the nations. Lamentations; comprehensive study regarding the fall of Jerusalem.

ESC-502 [3].....Eschatology II

Course Description: In-depth study by Dr. Sherlock Bally into the Book of Revelation; concerning death, judgment and the final destiny of the soul and humankind.

BM-501 [3].....Biblical Ministry I

Course Description: The importance of how to develop effective ministries; Developing an Accurate Belief System; Discerning the Will of God; Discipleship and Fulfilling the Vision.
