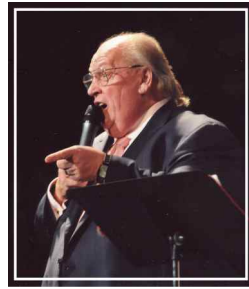

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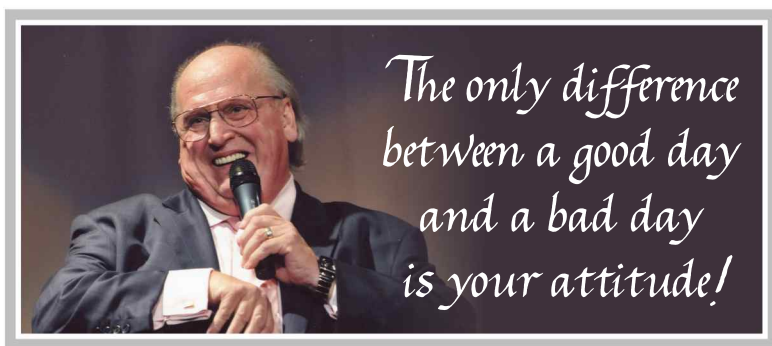

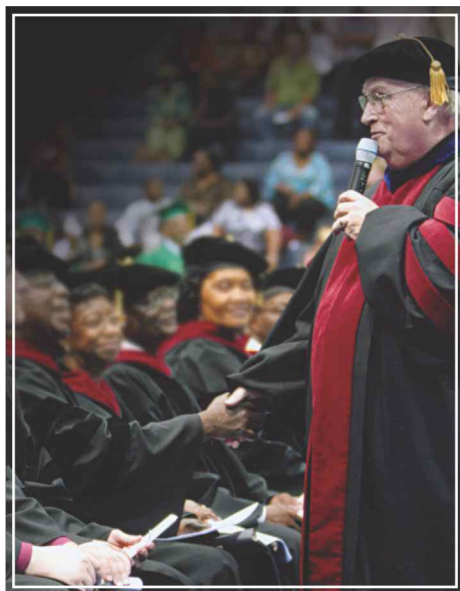

Administrative Policies

Our Program Basis

It is the purpose of the North Carolina Bible Institute (Administration / Main Campus) to provide continued education programs to students who are unable to attend full-time classes on the Main Campus. This can be accomplished through our external studies program. We believe that we offer the finest Christian education available in a streamlined fashion.

We have purposely abbreviated our requirements for graduate and post-graduate degrees in an effort to hold the tuition to a minimum and allow the busy minister ample time to complete his or her desired field of study. Our experienced staff and faculty have labored untiringly over textbooks and materials, separating arduous minor information from major academic information. We believe that upon review of the various programs, students will see we have streamlined the supporting areas of study by offering the same necessary information in condensed version for less reading and research of materials. It is our position that the same information can be obtained and retained by reading one book rather than three, provided it is the right book.

What We Believe

We are a fundamental, evangelical, Bible-believing school based upon canonized Old Testament and New Testament scripture as the inerrant and infallible Word of God. We accept that the Bible is God's instruction manual for life, and it is not open to any single or denominational interpretation but is written to all mankind.

It is our belief that God created the earth and the universe in six literal days and that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, born of a virgin. We believe that Jesus died on the cross at Calvary, arose from the dead three days later, and now sits at the right hand of God as our High Priest. We believe that those who have been born-again through the blood of Jesus Christ will reign in Heaven for eternity. Finally, we believe that non-believers will be sentenced to a burning hell for all eternity.

Staff and Faculty

Any corporation, institution, or government is only as good as its people, and they are its most valuable asset. The North Carolina Bible Institute has been richly blessed with quality staff and faculty. From the office of its president to the administrators and professors, you will find each individual ready and willing to assist every request. Our people are dedicated and loyal to the task of promoting God's Kingdom through quality Biblical education.

Curriculum and Reference Materials

The North Carolina Bible Institute seeks to offer the highest quality curriculum and reference materials. Resources are subject to change, at the discretion of the Executive Board of Directors, and not all subjects are offered every year.

Student Nondiscrimination Policy

The North Carolina Bible Institute admits students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin with all rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students of NCBI. The North Carolina Bible Institute does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its policies, loan programs, or other school administered programs.

Statement of Standards

All students are required to give a testimony of having accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. Each student is expected to conduct himself/herself in a manner that will, at no time, bring reproach upon our Savior or upon NCBI.

All students must be a working part of a local church. Time spent in participation within the local church will be logged and turned in to the North Carolina Bible Institute. These hours are figured into the student's semester credit hours as personal ministry. God's Word demands that we be doers of the Word and not hearers (or students) only.

Application Fee and Tuition

A non-refundable application fee of \$60.00 must accompany all applications. Upon approval of application, one-third of tuition, plus cost of textbooks, is due at REGISTRATION. Please note that NO textbooks will be released without pre-payment! Remaining balance of tuition and other applicable fees **MUST** be paid in full by April 15th of each school year. A 10% discount will be applied for all full prepayment tuitions. Any transferred or life-earned credits will be assessed at \$2.00 per credit hour.

Transferred Credits

The North Carolina Bible Institute reserves the right to allow, or not to allow, credits earned at other institutions for similar courses taken at that institution. If credit is awarded, the candidate will be assessed \$2.00 per credit hour. These hours may not exceed 60% of the required hours for graduation from the North Carolina Bible Institute.

Application for Advanced Standing

Simply enclose all of the information requested on the enrollment application, along with the appropriate fees. Make your check payable to and mail to the North Carolina Bible Institute. You will be given a detailed report of your advanced standing in the degree program of your choice.

Refund Policy

Students may change or drop a program at any time during the first week after notification of their acceptance into the North Carolina Bible Institute. When a program is dropped or withdrawn from and no substitute is taken, a 10% refund will be made, upon request. No refunds are given for Book Fees. A student must notify the North Carolina Bible Institute in writing of the intention to withdraw or drop a program. **NO REFUNDS ON DOCTORAL DEGREES.**

North Carolina Bible Institute Accreditation

If the sole purpose of needing an education is for the Gospel ministry or related field within Christian ministry, secular accreditation is not necessary or required. All Christian churches accept quality Christian education regardless to which accreditation group, if any, the referenced institution belongs. **If study is for purpose other than ministry, such as business administrator, engineer, lawyer, etc., students should apply to an institution that belongs to a regional accrediting association. In secular education, regional accreditation is essential!** For education of those in Christian service, secular accreditation does little more than typically make the tuition beyond the reach of most ministers.

However, North Carolina Bible Institute has been able to secure full accreditation through **Transworld Accrediting Commission International** (inquiries, please write: *Transworld Accrediting Commission International, 231 E. Alessandro Blvd., Suite A-210, Riverside, CA 92508 or call 951-901-5586* and through **Accrediting Commission International, Inc.** (inquiries, please write: Accrediting Commission International, Inc., PO Box 1030, Beebe, AR 72012). We have been able to secure these private accreditations and keep tuition costs at a minimum. We are proud to be associated with these accrediting institutions for Christian schools and colleges in the United States and abroad.

NCBI is a member and independent subsidiary of the **Accrediting Commission International, Inc.** This accrediting association is not formally recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, and NCBI has chosen not to be affiliated with any state or federal governmental agency. NCBI operates legally as an exempt educational institution in and out of the state of North Carolina.

VERY IMPORTANT

Degree programs of study offered by North Carolina Bible Institute have been declared by the appropriate state authority exempt from the requirements for licensure, under provisions of North Carolina General Statutes (G.S.) 116-15 (d) for exemption from licensure with respect to religious education. Exemption from licensure is not based upon assessment of program quality under established licensing standards.

- **Cost of TRANSCRIPTS: \$20.00 each...**Transcripts may be requested by contacting the NCBI Administration Offices. Upon request and receipt of payment, each transcript will be mailed directly to the requesting institution. Only one transcript per student may be requested to his/her own address for personal use.

Requirements of dissertations for each degree may be changed at any time by the President of NCBI at his/her discretion, upon variance of circumstances and life-earned experience of the student.

NCBI make no apology for being a Christian Bible Institute that proudly teaches the Word of God and trains men and women for ministry only. Institutes of NCBI should be church-based.

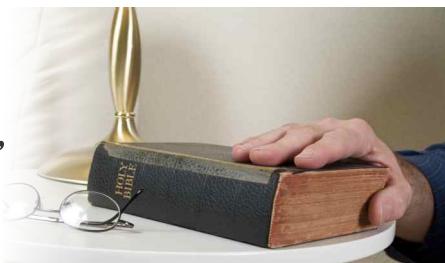

North Carolina College of Theology was founded in 2001 by the late, Dr. J. L. Cook. The college started in China Grove, NC with 9 students. Dr. Cook's purpose was to educate men and women of God that did not have the means or resources to attend college. In 2003 after the institution had grown considerable, Dr. Cook moved the college to Wilmington, NC. Under his leadership the college grew to students in 39 states and 112 countries.
